Ranger & Gardens Volunteering Update

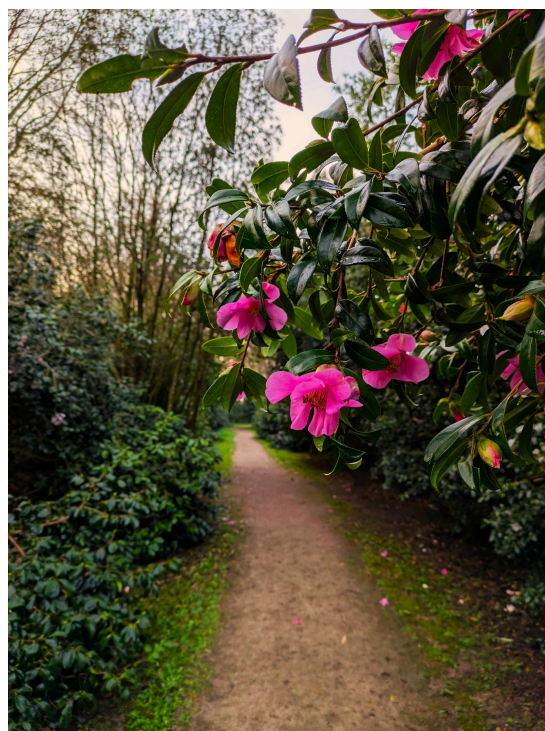
In order to change things up in 2026, each month we will be giving full updates on the amazing work carried out by our island volunteers.

We kick started conservation volunteering for the year with a bit of woodland management. Woodend wood (opposite the Fire Station), is a popular spot for walkers, residents, Forest School, and the Primary School, and as you'll know has been a focus of *Rhododendron ponticum* removal since 2023. We have now started to remove other invasive, less urgent, species such as Sitka spruce saplings and griselinia to make way for natural regeneration of our native broadleaf trees such as beech, rowan and birch, for a more diverse, wildlife friendly woodland, and one that is a little prettier for visitors.

On top of that, it is also stormy season, and that means... Beach cleans. Amazing residents have been filling the beach cleaning stations at Port na Carraigh, Grob Bagh, and Garbh, and volunteers have been out collecting all the microplastics, shredded plastic sheeting, strapping, and rope from the southside of Garbh beaches.



Stormy season in Achamore Gardens means much more wood clearance. This month volunteers have worked endlessly to process wood fuel for residents and clear storm damage from the occasional tree that is succumbing to the winds. But it doesn't end there, volunteers have also been collecting leaf litter for mulching and compost, and helping with the ditches to prevent flooding and drowned specimens.

Gigha Primary School and ELC

This month primary pupils have been learning about the Sustainable Development Goals and are beginning to think more deeply about ways in which they can help protect the world around them whilst challenging global inequalities. We have focussed on the work of UNICEF in other countries which has helped pupils learn more about how other children around the world live. Pupils have asked lots of interesting questions to further their understanding and link their learning back to their own life on Gigha.

At school, the pupils' sustainable egg project is well underway and 'Fresh Egg Friday' has become a popular part of the week. Eggs have sold out each week, once in a record time of 8 minutes! We would like to thank everyone who supports this project. Older pupils are tracking the ongoing profit/expenses associated with the chickens and have decided to purchase another chicken with the profit they have built to help grow their enterprise.



In the ELC, the theme of farming has been very popular with children building their own cow to milk. We were also very excited to have a visit from Sean Harvey with his tractor who taught us more about the role of machinery in modern day farming. Thank you, Sean!

Next week is our last week of term and we are looking forward to the end of term trip to Glencoe where, as well as sledging, pupils will also be taking snow samples to find out the answer to the question 'Are microplastics found in snow?' Pupils have also been learning more about their unique island heritage and are beginning to think about the impact which climate change is having on the island. At the recent Burns Supper, children asked some of the island elders how the island had changed both physically and socially across their lives and were interested to find out that there were previously highland cattle at farms on Gigha. The children, staff and island elders enjoyed a delicious meal and shared traditional poetry and music.
