Board update

As we have previously informed you, the financial position of the Trust requires some attention. The economic environment is not good in general, and a specific reduction in the Trust's turbine income from the loss of ROCs is projected. As part of the Board's responsibilities, this issue needs to be addressed. We are giving this consideration at an appropriate stage to achieve an effect early next year.

In looking at our overall financial position, the Board has determined that it is necessary to look at staffing costs and possible redundancies.

This has been a difficult and unenviable task. To date the information that we have given to members has been limited and restricted as the need for confidentiality has been vital given that this is sensitive and involves the livelihood of staff members.

The process is still ongoing and those affected are aware. The Board will provide information when possible.

The Board accepts that speculation is inevitable but are restricted in what information can be released while the process is ongoing. Given which, we would ask members to take any rumours with a pinch of salt. For example, there is a rumour that the Gardens are to be sold; this is incorrect and there are no such plans.

Development Update

- This month we secured completion certificates for 1-5 Ard Bruach, welcoming tenants to move in and start to occupy their homes. Whilst it has taken far longer than anticipated to secure completion, we hope the tenants enjoy their new homes. Thanks to our contractor, design team and funders for supporting this project through to completion.
- Plans are still on-going to progress the MUGA project. £230k has now been secured however following receipt of tenders, we expect the total project cost to be £260k. We are therefore seeking additional funds before we can accept a tender and progress works.
- Works continue within the Hotel, mainly focusing on the kitchen area to allow the team to start providing food in the near future. We are seeking funding to install solar panels and upgrade the heating system to support a financially and environmentally sustainable future for the property.
- We are currently seeking tenders to progress the next stage of feasibility work on the replacement of the Dancing Ladies. This next stage would include a review of the previous reports concluded and starting engagement with key stakeholders including community consultation.
- Planning permission was submitted for 4 pods and additional parking within the campsite boundary. Due to updated SEPA flood risk mapping, we are working with the Council to identify suitable locations for the pods on the campsite.

Island Ranger Service

Autumn is marvellous, the light makes everything look magical, the fungi and slime moulds are everywhere, and the leaves are the best colours at this time of year. We have spotted lots of wildlife in the last few weeks, flocks of pink footed, barnacle and Greenland white fronted geese are dropping in, the wigeon are back and making full use of our lochens, there are hedgehogs and rabbits galore, and beautiful hen harriers are hunting at the south end. The white-tailed sea eagle is back too, so keep your eyes peeled, lots of sightings have been recorded on Gigha in the last couple of weeks! Our Adult Autumn Woodland Sessions are also due to return! This autumn we have three sessions on offer: charcoal making and art, whittling and wax carving, and macrame! Pop us an email for more information, or to book on ranger@gigha.org.uk!

Island Ranger Service Continued

Kintyre Coastal Network and the Marine Scotland Enhancement Fund have approached us about the seagrass meadows we have around our shorelines, to understand if our community would be interested in sea-ing and being involved in a nationwide seagrass initiative until 2028. Other projects within this partnership scheme include: replanting washed up seagrass shoots in Wester Ross; surveying, harvesting and transplanting rhizomes, processing seeds and replanting seagrass in East Kintyre; and seagrass translocation in the Moray Firth and in Shetland. https://smeef.scot/project-theme/seagrass-planting-programme/

We are asking the community to get in touch to give us your thoughts on a potential seagrass project. Things for us to consider include the developments and marine traffic on the east of Gigha, the Special Protection Area designation given to the Sound of Gigha for the overwintering seabirds, and the recent contribution to the Priority Marine Features consultation regarding the maerl beds in the waters off the south coast.





We are soon to be part of an exciting research project! We have received £9,540 from Future Woodlands Scotland for a research project that will trial new drone imaging technologies to map Rhododendron ponticum presence, volume, and topography using multispectral drone surveys.

Why would this help us, I hear you ask, well... Our previous NatureScot project in 2023 was successful in treating 15 hectares of Rhododendron ponticum. We have been delighted with the success, but this project had huge challenges. Primarily, creating budgets for treatment programmes was difficult as standard budgeting tools are based around outdated plant categorisation which do not take into account topography, or the volume and density of plants. All our surveys were done on foot or using basic drone images for this project, and despite site visits with each potential contractor, it was impossible to fully relay the scale of the R.ponticum growth we have here. The salt and wind pressures, as well as previous management, make these plants multi-stemmed, interconnected, and impenetrable. On top of that, each year that a plant is not treated, it releases more seed, meaning the spread of the species is faster than we could accurately survey on foot.

Therefore, we are involved in a trial for the effectiveness of multispectral drone imaging for 41 hectares of land where R.ponticum is present by using light sensors to identify plant presence, assess the topography which will inform access and equipment, and the volume and density of the plants.

Despite hours of research and phone calls, we couldn't find any examples where new technologies could survey R.ponticum for on-the-ground control and treatment programmes, with the exception of a dissertation at University of Edinburgh which looked at multispectral surveys for R.ponticum presence in woodlands only. So it seems we are a little bit ahead of the curve. The benefit of this funding for us will be the ability to accurately create maps for control projects and monitoring purposes, and will be useful in creating budgets to complete the work. We're looking forward to seeing the results!


